

Kevin Kieschnick is a lifelong South Texas resident, who grew up working with his family on their family farms. At 9 years old he was stomping cotton trailers and shoveling grain. By age 12 he was operating heavy equipment, including tractors, shredders, and Cotton Module Builders. At 14 he graduated on to combines. In November of 2012, Kevin won the general election and is now serving his 3rd term as Tax Assessor-Collector. Prior to becoming Tax Assessor-Collector, Kevin Kieschnick served two terms on the Corpus Christi City Council. During that tenure he served as Vice President of the Corpus Christi Housing Finance Corporation, Administrative Committee, Municipal Court Committee, and served as Mayor Pro-Tem. Kevin Kieschnick became involved in the political process because of his strong desire to see Corpus Christi and Nueces County prosper.

Kevin is proud to call Corpus Christi home. His Banking career took him to San Antonio in late 1999, and he returned to Corpus Christi in 2004.
